These cables consist of 12 to 216 fibers organized into 12-fiber ribbons inside a central tube. Dielectric strength members provide tensile strength while a

A Yellow jacket universally signifies Single-mode fiber (OS1 or OS2), which has a 9µm core and is designed for long-distance, high-speed transmission using laser
