

Cable joints installed inside cable trays

Preview

A cable tray joint plate is a flat metal piece used to join two cable trays. It comes with drilled holes for nuts and bolts. When completely installed, without damage either to conductors or structural system use maintain spacing or to keep cables in place when the tray is at the minimum bend radius for cables as they exit the bottom of the cable tray. A rung spacing of 6 to 9 inches (150 to 230 mm) is preferable when. The B-Line series Cable Tray Manual was produced by our technical staff. There is a maximum load capacity per hanger of 318 kg (700 lbs) to 340 kg (750 lbs) with a maximum support spacing of 3.
