

Can the fiber optic cable on the router be unplugged

- o Grip the connector, not the cable: Always pull on the plastic connector body to avoid stressing the fragile fibers inside .
- o Pull straight and gently: Avoid twisting, wiggling, or bending the cable. Apply steady, controlled pressure along the connector axis .
- o Cap exposed ends immediately: Place protective caps on both the port and the cable end to prevent dust or dirt contamination .
- o Inspect for damage: After removal, check the connector for cracks or debris before reconnecting or storing .

Additional Tips

- o Avoid excessive force: If the connector resists, stop and reassess. For stubborn or recessed connectors, contact your ISP or a professional technician .
- o Service impact: Unplugging the main fiber cable will temporarily disable your internet connection until it is reconnected .
- o Power-up sequence: When reconnecting, power up the ONT first, wait for network lights to stabilize, then power up the router and other devices . By following these precautions and handling the cable carefully, you can safely unplug a fiber optic cable from your router without damaging the connection or affecting service.
