Key Considerations for Cable Selection

- o Voltage Rating: The cable must match the voltage level of the distribution system, commonly low-voltage (up to 1kV) for building and industrial distribution boxes, ensuring a safety margin for operational reliability .
- o Conductor Material: Copper is preferred for its excellent conductivity, while aluminum may be used for cost or weight considerations. Copper offers better mechanical strength and lower resistance, which is critical for minimizing energy losses .
- o Insulation Type:
 - o PVC (Polyvinyl Chloride): Common for low-voltage applications, cost-effective, and versatile.
 - o XLPE (Cross-linked Polyethylene): Offers higher thermal and chemical resistance, suitable for medium-voltage or environments with higher heat or chemical exposure .
 - o Rubber: Flexible and durable, ideal for industrial or portable applications .
- o Cable Configuration:
 - o Single-conductor cables: Easier to install and splice, suitable for multiple-cable circuits.
 - o Three-conductor cables with overall jacket: Balanced voltage stress, lower reactance, and includes a ground path for safety .
- o Current Carrying Capacity (Ampacity): The cable must handle the maximum anticipated load without overheating. Installation conditions, such as in trays, conduits, or embedded in walls, affect heat dissipation and may require adjusting the cable cross-section .
- o Environmental Resistance: Cables should withstand temperature variations, moisture, UV exposure (for outdoor boxes), and potential chemical or mechanical stresses .
- o Safety and Standards Compliance: Ensure cables meet relevant standards such as IEC 60228, NP EN 50525, and local electrical codes to guarantee fire safety and electrical performance .

Recommended Types for Distribution Boxes

- o Low-voltage PVC-insulated copper cables: Most common for indoor distribution boxes in residential and commercial buildings.
- o XLPE-insulated copper or aluminum cables: Suitable for higher current loads or industrial environments.
- o Flexible rubber-insulated cables: Used when mechanical flexibility is required, such as in movable or industrial setups. By considering these factors--voltage, conductor material, insulation, ampacity, and environmental conditions--you can select a cable that ensures safe, reliable, and long-lasting operation of a
