- o Type of fiber: Single-mode for long distances, multimode for shorter runs .
- o Connector type: LC, SC, ST, or MTP/MPO depending on switch or panel compatibility .
- o Strand count: Duplex (two strands) is standard for most SFP connections .
- o Bending and handling: Fiber should not be bent beyond manufacturer specifications to avoid signal loss or microfractures .
