

How is the price of fiber optic cable laying calculated

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- o Decide between trenching, directional boring, aerial, or indoor installation.
- o Estimate Material Cost
 - o Multiply the per-foot cable cost by the total length, adjusting for armor, jacket type, and fiber count .
- o Estimate Labor Cost
 - o Multiply expected labor hours by hourly rates, considering route complexity and installation method .
- o Add Permits and Miscellaneous Costs
 - o Include fees for permits, traffic control, and surface restoration.
- o Calculate Total Project Cost
 - o Total Cost = Material Cost + Labor Cost + Permits + Equipment + Contingency (typically 10-15% for unexpected issues).

Example Estimate

For a 1,000-foot single-mode fiber run using open trench in a suburban area:

- o Cable cost: $\$1.50/\text{ft} \times 1,000 \text{ ft} = \$1,500$
- o Labor: $40 \text{ hours} \times \$50/\text{hr} = \$2,000$
- o Permits and restoration: \$500
