

How to lay cables in rooftop cable trays

Properly laying cables in rooftop cable trays requires secure support, correct spacing, protection from environmental factors, and allowance for thermal expansion.

Planning and Preparation

Installing Cable Tray Supports

Rooftop cable trays require purpose-built supports that distribute weight evenly and protect the roofing membrane. Non-penetrating supports with wide rubber or polymer bases are preferred to avoid leaks . Supports should be spaced according to the tray material, cable weight, and expected temperature fluctuations, typically no more than 2 feet from expansion joints . Ensure supports are level and properly braced to prevent sagging or misalignment .

Laying the Cables

- o De-energize cables before installation to protect insulation and ensure safety .
- o Place cables evenly within the tray, avoiding tight bends or overlapping that could cause stress.
- o Use cable ties or clamps sparingly to secure cables without restricting thermal expansion.
- o Maintain separation between high-voltage and low-voltage cables if required by code.

Expansion and Environmental Considerations

Rooftop trays expand and contract due to temperature changes. Install expansion joints at tray connections to allow movement without stressing cables or supports . Ensure trays are UV-resistant and protected from wind uplift, snow, and ice accumulation .

Ensure that all trays are accessible for maintenance and that the roof membrane remains intact . Regular inspections help prevent sagging, cable damage, and water infiltration.
