Cable ladder systems and cable tray systems are designed for use as supports for cables and not as enclosures giving full mechanical protection. They are not intended to be used as ladders, walk ways

Lay the cable tray on the floor in the area where it will be installed. Mark the anchoring locations on the tray and hold a laser pointer and a level at the marks on the tray.
