

How to replace a telecom fiber optic router

To replace a fiber optic router, connect your compatible router to the ISP-provided ONT, configure settings, and ensure it supports your fiber plan's speeds.

Step 1: Check Compatibility

Fiber internet uses an Optical Network Terminal (ONT) instead of a traditional modem. Your new router must have a Gigabit Ethernet WAN port to connect to the ONT and support the speed tier of your fiber plan. Routers designed for DSL or cable won't work, and older Wi-Fi 4 or Wi-Fi 5 routers may limit performance. A Wi-Fi 6 or 6E router is recommended for optimal speed and device management .

Step 2: Prepare for Replacement

- o Contact your ISP to confirm any restrictions and to arrange the return of the existing router to stop rental fees .
- o Choose a central location for your new router to minimize dead zones and avoid obstructions like metal, concrete, or brick .
- o Remove physical obstacles and ensure antennas are properly connected and extended if applicable .

Step 3: Connect the Router

- o Ensure the ONT is active and connected to the fiber line.
- o Use an Ethernet cable to connect the ONT to the router's WAN port .
- o Power on the router and wait for it to initialize.

Step 4: Configure Router Settings

- o Access the router's admin panel via a browser using its IP address.
- o Update network name (SSID), password, and security settings.
- o Configure VLAN, DHCP, or PPPoE settings if required by your ISP .
- o Disable unnecessary features like remote access or AP isolation if not needed for your network .

Step 5: Test and Optimize

- o Check internet speed to confirm full fiber performance.
- o Reboot or reset the router if connectivity issues arise.
- o Upgrade legacy devices if they cannot handle the new Wi-Fi standard, as older devices may bottleneck network performance .

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o Consider using Wi-Fi extenders or mesh systems if coverage is insufficient.
