A single-core pigtail is a fiber optic cable with one optical fiber, featuring a factory-installed connector on one end and a bare fiber on the other for splicing.

Definition and Structure

A single-core pigtail is a short length of optical fiber designed to connect optical devices to a fiber optic network. One end has a factory-terminated connector (such as LC, SC, ST, or FC), while the other end is bare and prepared for fusion or mechanical splicing to a fiber optic cable in the field . This design ensures low insertion loss and high reliability on the connector side while allowing flexible integration into existing fiber infrastructure. The "single-core" designation means the pigtail contains only one optical fiber, as opposed to multi-core pigtails that bundle multiple fibers together for higher-density connections .

Applications

Single-core pigtails are commonly used in:

- o Optical Distribution Frames (ODFs)
- o Fiber terminal boxes
- o Patch panels
- o Data centers and telecommunications networks They serve as a bridge between pre-terminated connectors and the fiber backbone, enabling permanent splicing with minimal signal loss .
