Tray-Rated Cables vs BV Cable

Tray-rated cables, such as Type TC (Tray Cable) or Type ITC (Instrumentation Tray Cable), are specifically tested for:

- o Mechanical resistance (crush and impact)
 - o Flame retardancy
 - o Temperature limits
 - o Exposure rating (ER) for short unsupported runs outside the tray
- BV cable lacks these certifications, so using it in a tray may require additional protection, such as conduits or separation from high-temperature or high-mechanical-stress areas.

Recommendations

- o For short, low-stress installations, BV cable may be used in cable trays if the tray is not exposed to mechanical damage, high temperatures, or fire hazards.
- o For industrial or high-risk environments, it is safer to use tray-rated cables that comply with UL, CE, or other relevant standards .

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- o Ensure proper spacing, support, and securing of BV cables in the tray to prevent sagging or overheating.
- o Always verify local electrical codes and manufacturer guidelines before installation. In summary, while BV cable can be installed in cable trays under controlled conditions, tray-rated cables are preferred for compliance, safety, and long-term reliability.
