Ensure Safety and Compliance: Install the distribution box in a dry, accessible area with good ventilation, typically around 1.5 meters from the floor . Follow local electrical and network standards (NEC, IEC, or UL/CE certifications) to prevent short circuits, interference, or fire hazards . 5. Test and Maintain: Before powering on, perform visual inspections and continuity tests with a multimeter or network tester to ensure all connections are correct . Schedule regular inspections to check for damaged cables, loose connections, or dust accumulation .
