

What are the specifications of a complete electrical distribution box

- o Supply system compatibility: Single-phase or three-phase AC, DC, and various earthing systems (TN, TT, IT) are supported .

Enclosure Specifications

- o Material: Polycarbonate (PC), Acrylonitrile Styrene Acrylate (ASA), epoxy-coated or powder-coated steel for corrosion resistance .
- o Protection rating: IP20-IP65 or NEMA 1-3R depending on indoor/outdoor use .
- o Mounting: Wall-mounted or floor-standing, with secure brackets to prevent movement or vibration .
- o Ventilation and heat dissipation: Adequate internal space and ventilation to prevent overheating .

Installation Guidelines

- o Height: Typically 1.5-1.8 meters above ground for easy access .
- o Location: Dry, well-ventilated, and close to the main power supply; avoid humid or corrosive environments .

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- o Wiring: High-temperature resistant copper conductors with cross-sectional area matching load requirements; proper labeling and secure connections .
- o Grounding: Metal enclosures, internal boards, and appliances must be properly grounded; protective neutral and leakage protection devices are recommended .

Additional Features

- o Smart DB boxes: May include energy monitoring, communication modules, and integration with home automation systems .
- o Explosion-proof variants: Required for flammable or hazardous environments, following specific material and grade standards .
